The book of Philemon is very short. It has only 1 chapter and just verses.				
It is a book we tend to overlook but it contains great principles for us.				
Philemon was a great friend of the and Scripture indicates they had a very close relationship.				
Philemon was well off from the material perspective and even supported Paul on some of his missionary journeys.				
Philemon had a slave / servant working for him by the name of Onesimus.				
Most slaves / servants in those days were people who had borrowed money and worked for an agreed upon time to repay the debt.				
Historians believe this was probably the case with Onesimus.				
One day, Onesimus gets tired of doing the work to repay his debt, decides he's had enough and decides to no longer honor his agreement with Philemon.				
And to make things worse, Onesimus sneaks into the Philemon's home and more money from him.				
Onesimus is living it up on stolen money in Rome. But one day, he runs across one of Philemon's best friends,				
Paul winds up connecting with Onesimus and him to the Lord.				
Paul writes this letter to Philemon and sends to deliver it to him.				

Philemon 1:5-21 NLT

"I always thank my God when I pray for you, Philemon, because I keep hearing about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all of God's people. And I am praying that you will put into action the generosity that comes from your faith as you understand and experience all the good things we have in Christ. Your love has given me much joy and comfort, my brother, for your kindness has often refreshed the hearts of God's people. That is why I am boldly asking a favor of you. I could demand it in the name of Christ because it is the right thing for you to do. But because of our love, I prefer simply to ask you. Consider this as a request from me—Paul, an old man and now also a prisoner for the sake of Christ

Jesus. I appeal to you to show kindness to my child, Onesimus. I became his father in the faith while here in prison. Onesimus hasn't been of much use to you in the past, but now he is very useful to both of us. I am sending him back to you, and with him comes my own heart. I wanted to keep him here with me while I am in these chains for preaching the Good News, and he would have helped me on your behalf. But I didn't want to do anything without your consent. I wanted you to help because you were willing, not because you were forced. It seems you lost Onesimus for a little while so that you could have him back forever. He is no longer like a slave to you. He is more than a slave, for he is a beloved brother, especially to me. Now he will mean much more to you, both as a man and as a brother in the Lord. So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. If he has wronged you in any way or owes you anything, charge it to me. I, PAUL, WRITE THIS WITH MY OWN HAND: I WILL REPAY IT. AND I WON'T MENTION THAT YOU OWE ME YOUR VERY SOUL! Yes, my brother, please do me this favor for the Lord's sake. Give me this encouragement in Christ. I am confident as I write this letter that you will do what I ask and even more!"
